POLICY STATEMENT #31

SUBJECT: Commander's Policy on Safety and Health

1. I am responsible for the safety and health of employees and the protection of property and assets at Anniston Army Depot.
2. Each line manager or supervisor is responsible for the safety and health of their employees and the protection of property and assets. In that regard, I expect line managers and supervisors to actively enforce safety and health provisions and prevent accidents.
3. Each employee is responsible for complying with established safety and health rules and regulations. Additionally, each employee must strive for accident-free operations by maintaining safe work habits and reporting hazards.
4. Non-compliance with established safety rules and regulations will not be tolerated. The Director of Risk Management will ensure I am notified of any willful safety and health violation, and I will hold all associated individuals fully responsible for their actions. This means managers, supervisors, and employees will be held personally accountable for cases of willful non-compliance.
5. I encourage all to actively participate in the safety and health program. Ideally, it will be a program molded to our individual and corporate needs, and it should promote safety and well being both on and off the job, as well as productivity and cost savings. However, safety will never be sacrificed for the sake of production-never.
6. This policy statement supercedes Policy Statement #31, dtd 14 Mar 00.
